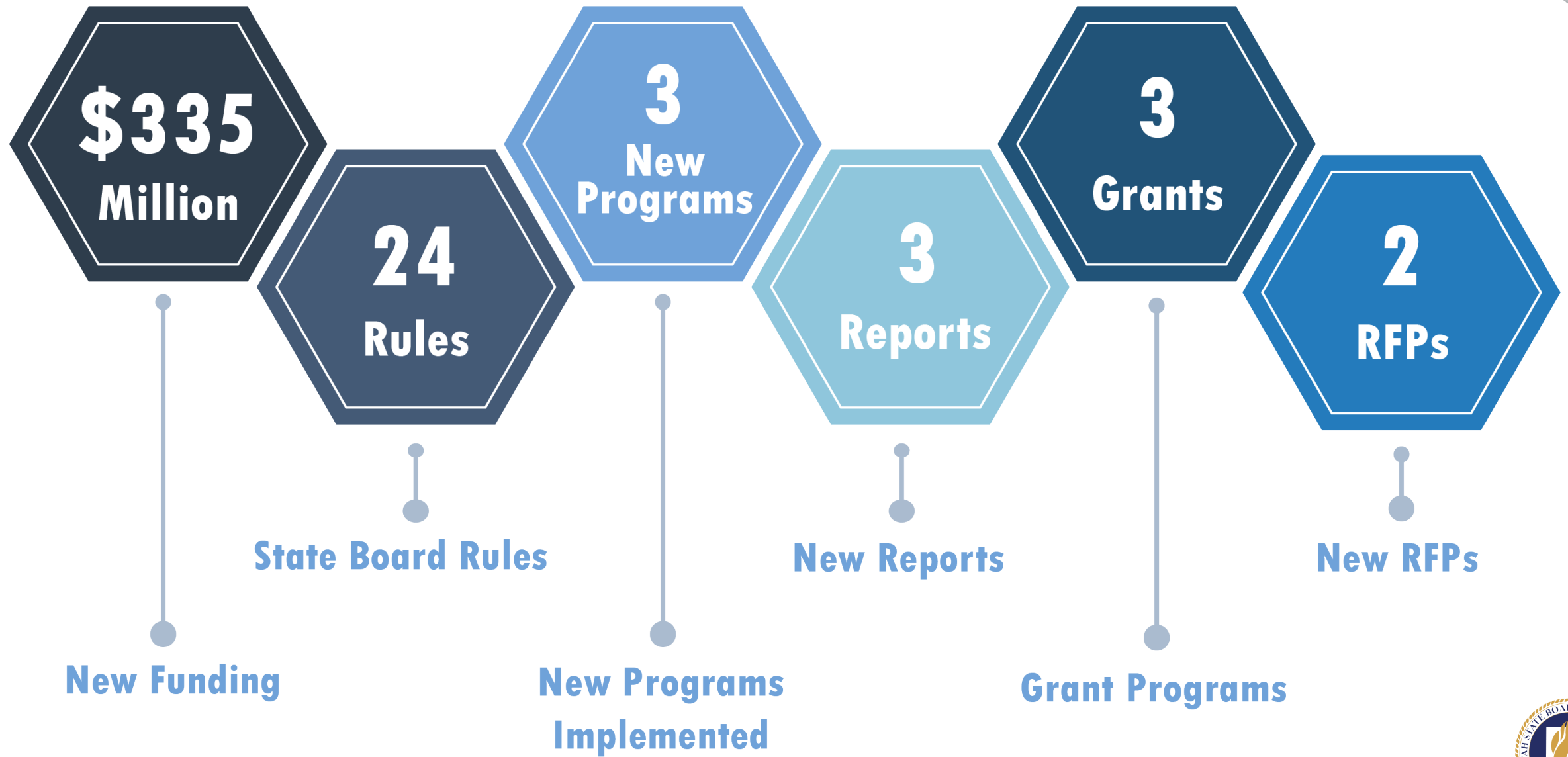

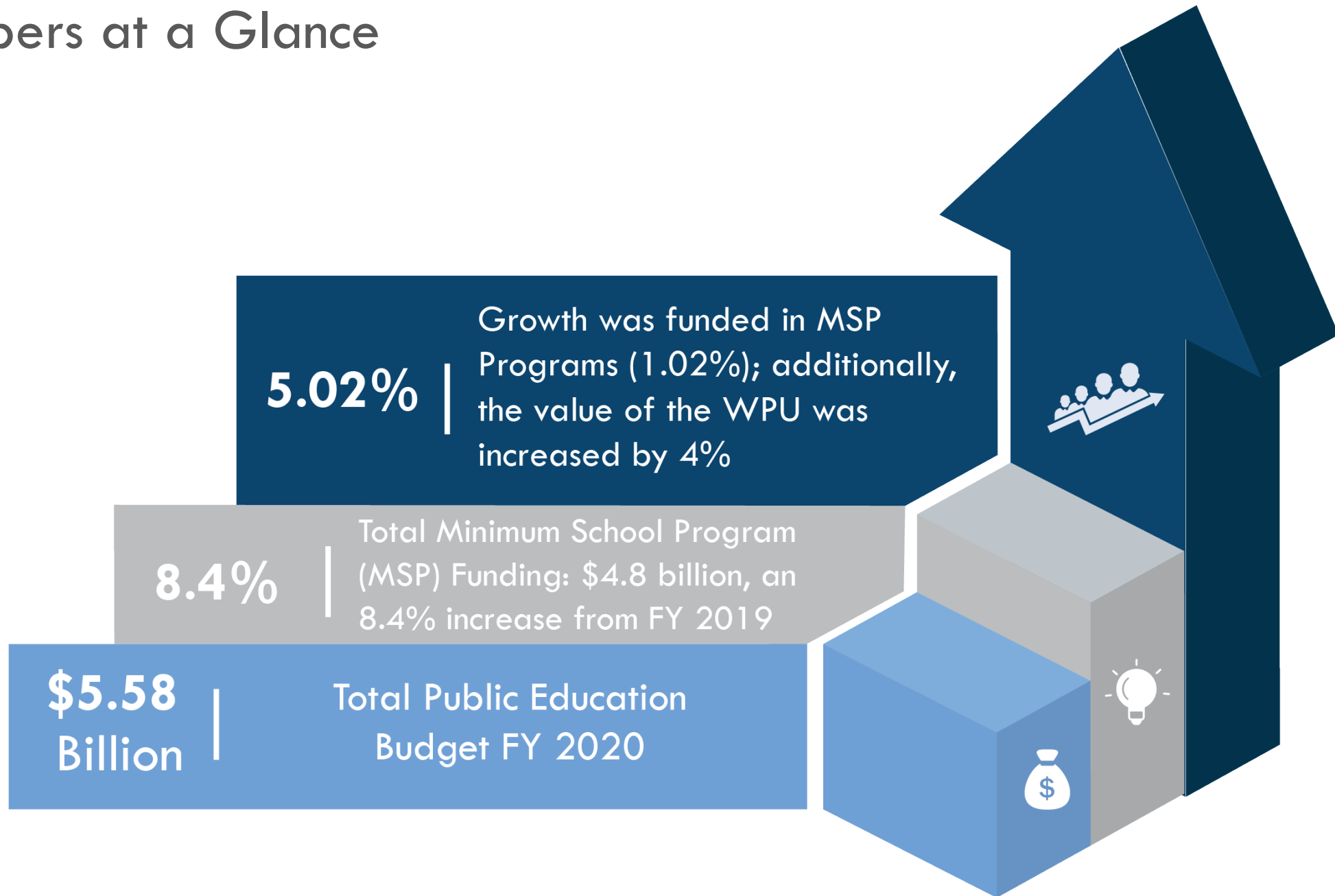

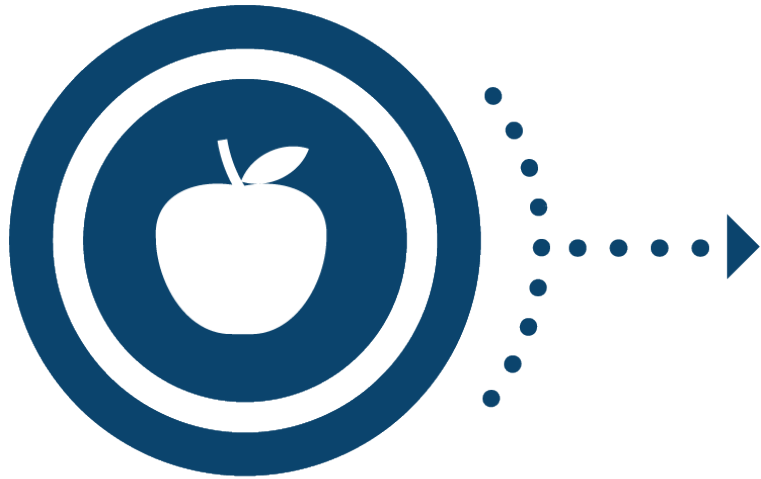

Enrollment Growth and WPU

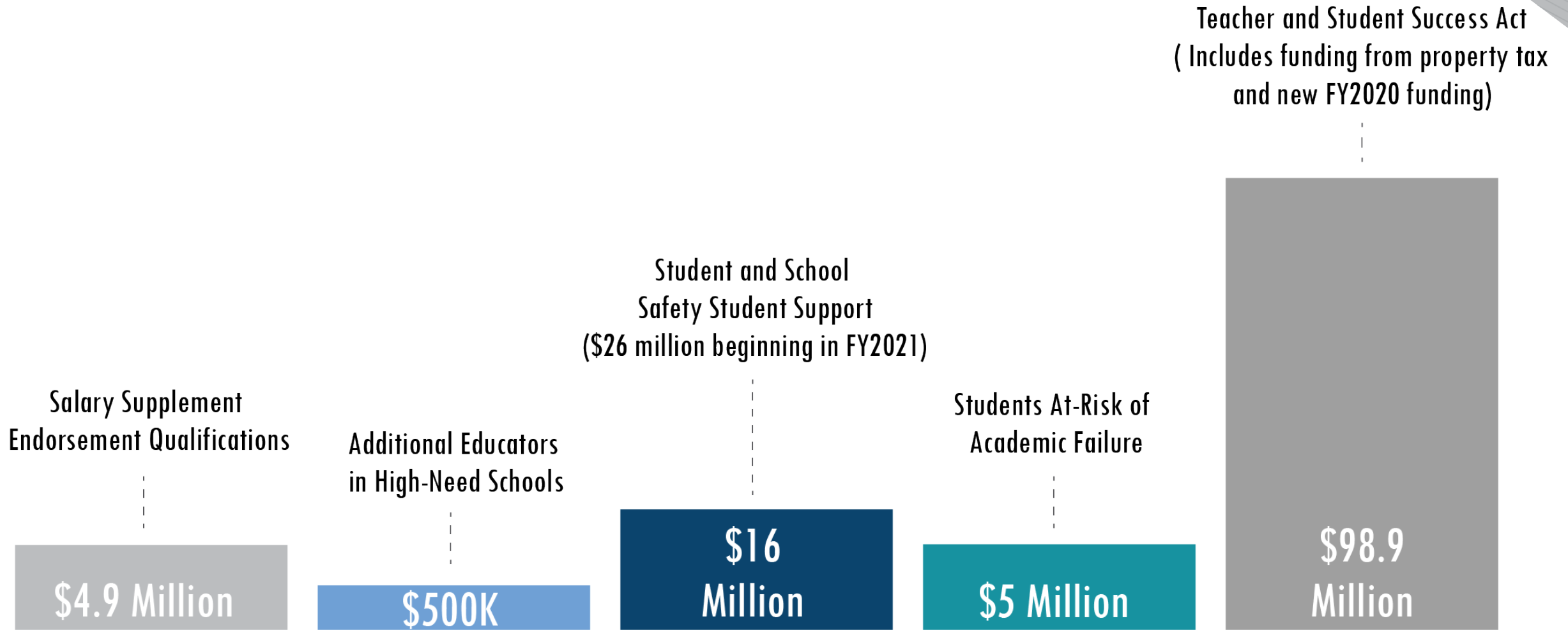
\$163,700,000 ongoing & \$4,300,000 one-time. This funding includes the WPU value increase. LEAs will be funded on the prior year ADM + growth. Enrollment growth was funded for an estimated increase of 6,750 students next year.



Voted and Board Local Levy Programs Increase

The Equity Pupil Tax Rate could increase the number of guaranteed local levy increments up to 20 for either the Voted or Board Local Levy Programs with appropriated funds of \$49 million.

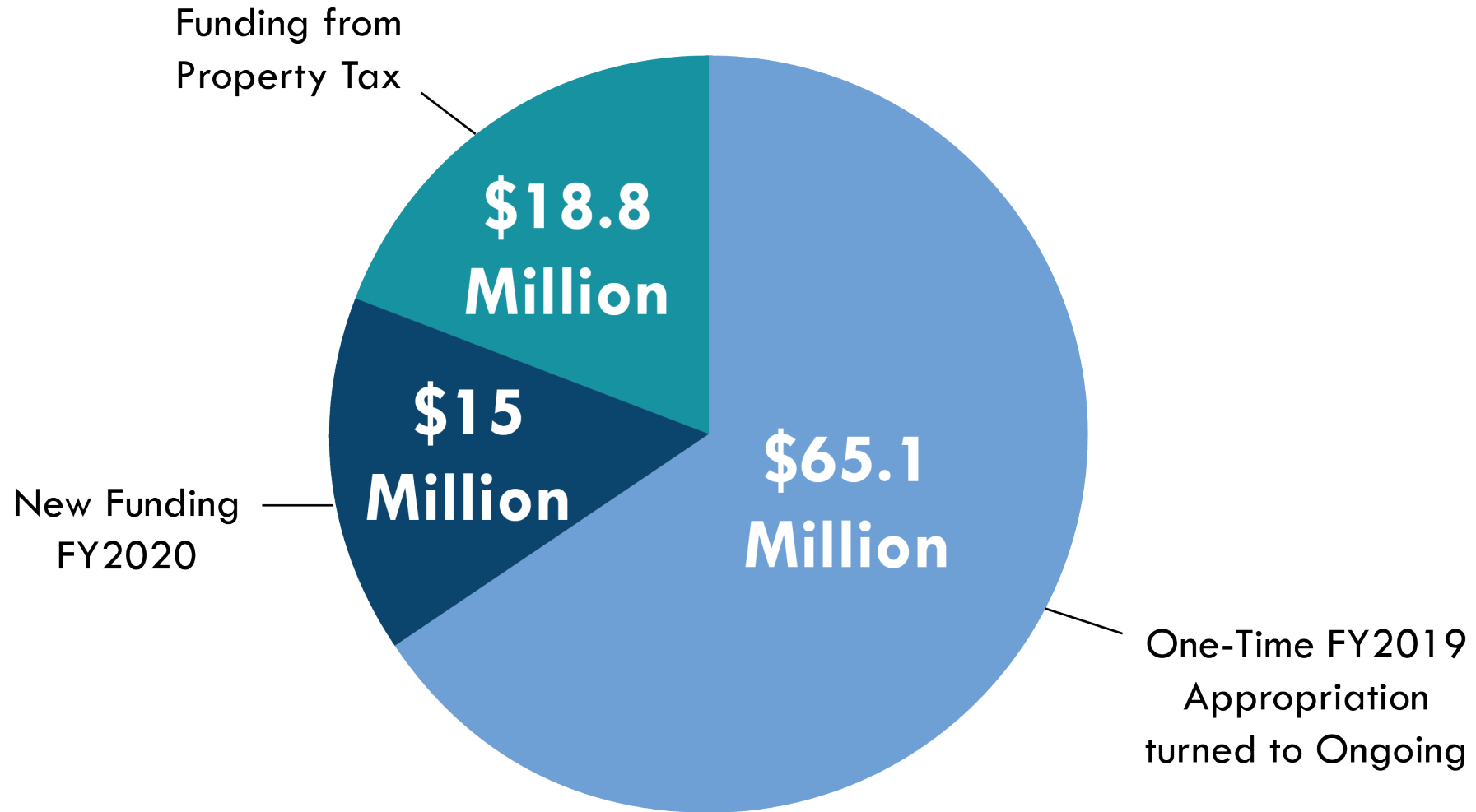

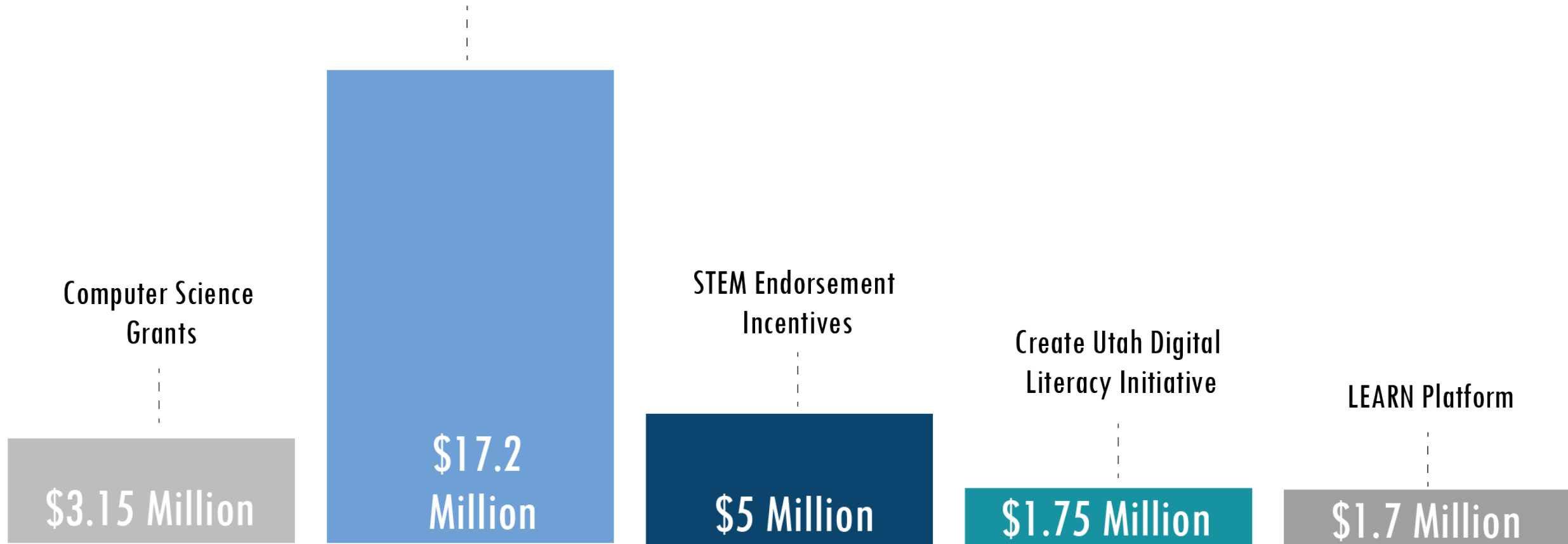

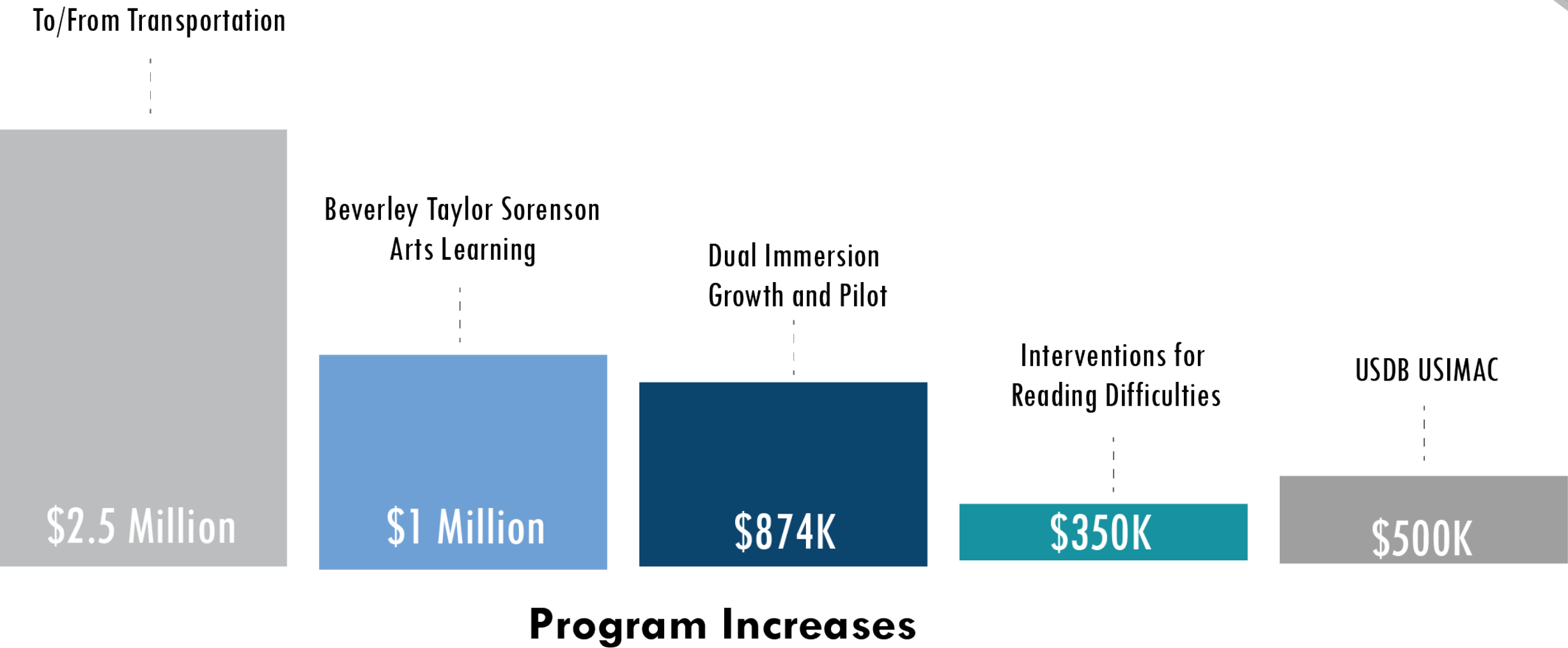

HB 120 - STUDENT AND SCHOOL SAFETY ASSESSMENT



HB 373 - STUDENT SUPPORT AMENDMENTS

Notable Education Bills

HB 120 Funding

\$150,000 - Ongoing	Creation and implementation of a student support team pilot program
\$330,000 - Ongoing	School Safety technical assistance for district/charter school including training, materials, curriculum, and USBE staffing for data analysis.
\$150,000 - Ongoing	School-based Mental Health Specialist to be hired by DSAMH.
\$150,000 - Ongoing	School Public Safety Law Enforcement Liaison hired by DPS.



Notable Education Bills

HB 373 Funding

\$16 Million - Ongoing

Fund LEA qualified plans for school-based mental health supports to support:

- School-based mental health support personnel
- Contract services with the local health organization.

Funding increases to \$26 Million in FY2021

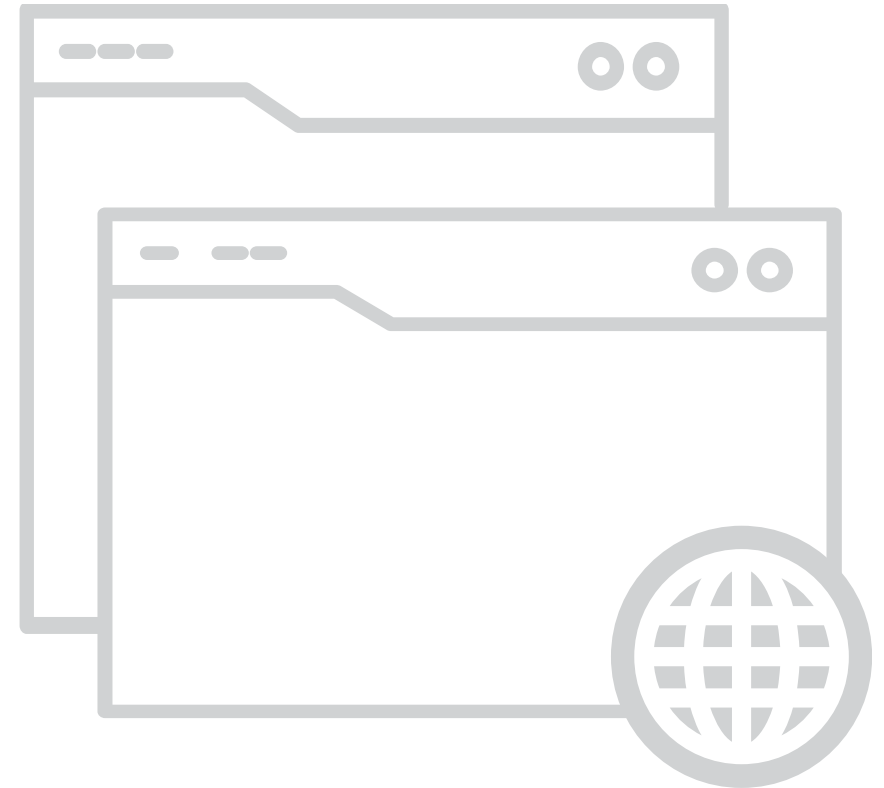

SB 112 - USIMS

Utah School Information Management System (USIMS)

Modernize legacy data systems and enable real-time access to inform decision making at all levels of the education system; while also safeguarding against data breaches.



Notable Education Bills

SB 112 - USIMS

\$17.2 Million – One-Time

Funding to be disbursed over the next 3.5 years to cover the following aspects of the project:

- Define Requirements
- System Architecture
- Network Implementations
- Computer Implementations
- Continuity of Operations Plan Implementations
- Transactional Database Development
- Data Warehouse Development
- Web User Interface Development
- Authorized portal Interface Development
- Business Intelligence Development and Integration and Initial Report Creation
- Comprehensive Testing
- Documentation
- Training



Notable Education Bills

HB 250 – School Fees

To ensure fees in the public schools do not create a barrier to full-participation to any student, regardless of their financial circumstances by:



Creating Standards and Requirements



Clarifying and updating definitions



Requiring LEAs to provide fee waivers

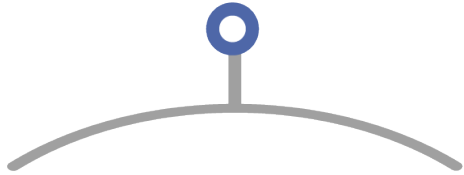

HB 250 – School Fees

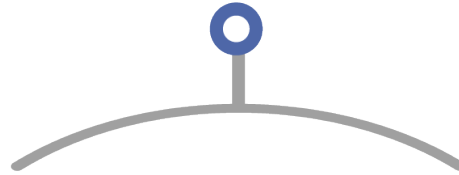
July 1, 2019: Bill takes effect

School Year
2020-2021



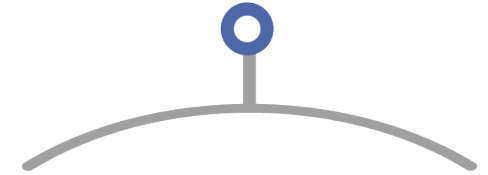
- Expensive school Uniforms are fees and subject to waivers.
- Activities or Classes with multiple fees must list fees on the schedule.

School Year
2021-2022



- Fees must be equal or less than cost of activity.
- Cannot use one fee to subsidize another fee or waivers.
- Board takes corrective actions.

School Year
2022-2023



- LEA may not sell textbooks or otherwise charge a text-book fee.



Notable Education Bills

Teacher and Student Success Act – SB 149

Local Governing Boards Create a student success framework and submit it to the State Board of Education.

Local Governing Boards may use up to 25-40% of the LEA's TSSA allocation for increases to base salary and salary driven benefits for school personnel if the LEA's average teacher salary is below the statewide average teacher salary.



Notable Education Bills

Teacher and Student Success Act – SB 149

Local Governing Boards approve individual school TSSA plans, which are developed by the school's principal in consultation with the school's school community council, school level educators, parents, and school level administrators.

The school level money shall be used to implement the school's approved TSSA plan.

Schools that meet performance standards maintain school level flexibility over the school's TSSA plan.

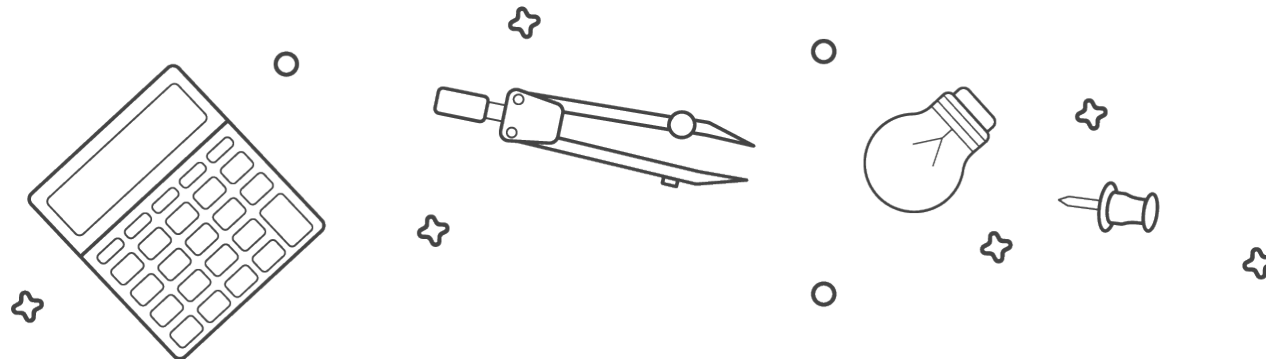

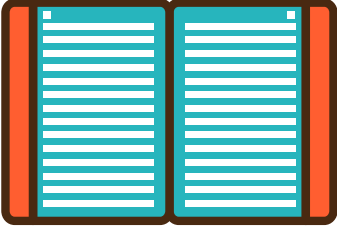
